Sermons

One of the advantages of being an Editor (albeit retiring) and an organist, is that I can choose which sermons I listen to attentively and those that will just pass me by. (You may do the same, but nobody can see me!) Recently I've heard two Advent sermons that the preachers have kindly allowed me to share with you – for me, there was something special about each one.

The first Carol Service of the Season was held in Cognac, where Pastor Cyrille Payot delivered a thought-provoking sermon in French, but kindly produced the following translation:

Throughout the Biblical readings, the story is centred around a place of birth – the small town of Bethlehem, about 10 kilometres from Jerusalem. Jesus is said to have been born there No archaeological trace has been discovered in support of this. Specialists consider that it is perhaps an attempt, on the part of the Evangelists, to reconcile the Judean countryside with the capital city. But it doesn't really matter to us whether Jesus was born in one stable or another.

Do you know what 'Bethlehem' means in Hebrew? *Beith-Larem*, literally the "House of Bread".

Recently the French 'baguette' has been classified as an intangible cultural heritage by UNESCO.

In the Bible, **bread** receives a much better press than that other French symbol, the cock whose cry tolled the *Brexit* for the disciples. In a similar way, in the Bible, God has inscribed Bethlehem, the 'House of Bread', in His intangible cultural heritage as the symbolic location where the whole history of the Son of God begins.

But, on reflection, it is a contradiction to consider that the materials used to make bread are immaterial. The explanation lies in the fact that the *baguette* is not just flour and water, kneaded then cooked, but the result of a tradition, a way of life. The same applies to our life as believers. All the material things are part of a living tradition which is much more than a simple assembly of elements: a tradition which paves the way to peace, to sharing, to the love of the neighbour which represent together the heritage of God and the Gospels.

In the Lord's Prayer, we ask God for our 'daily bread', today's bread – not yesterday's or tomorrow's. Bread becomes immaterial when it is available for sharing, when it enables us to surpass ourselves, to open ourselves to an immaterial world heritage.

It's a strange heritage which we ask for *each day*. Not a legacy which clutters up our attics, but an inheritance which is shared, which lasts for only one day. Our prayer is that the bread, like the sharing, is to be renewed regularly in our daily lives. The life of Jesus, from Bethlehem to the Cross, is a permanent illustration of this.

Here we have our Christmas present. We in turn appreciate this present all the more when we pass rom words to action. That is why I propose to replace "the word which dwelt within us" by "the shared bread". Let's take this further to see what it gives. "In the beginning was the Baguette, and the Baguette was with God and the Baguette (or the Daily Bread) was God. It was in the beginning with God. Within it was life and life was the light of mankind. The light shone in the darkness and nor did the darkness stop it;" Nothing can stop a ray of light as it passes through a house when it is a question of sharing what is best in us. It is there that lies the immaterial cultural heritage which we can offer man as daily bread.

When we experience a "Brexit" in our lives, this Advent-tide can be a present, a gift of bread and wine which are shared in unique fashion, as ever loaf is unique.

The theologian psychoanalyst Denis Vasse wrote "It is not true that man or the community show their real value only in action;" An action has meaning only when it opens up on "something more", on a presence which cannot be simplified to satisfy a need. This is where the immaterial becomes involved in the material of bread. In the Gospel, Jesus breaks bread into crumbs in front of a crowd in the desert. When bread is broken, there is no limit and there is something for everyone. The Gospel says that the bread is not multiplied but reduced to crumbs. Hence the miracle that the hunger of the crowd is assuaged by crumbs you may not believe this, so I will end with this true story, which is both concrete and material, but is also immaterial.

Miguel Brun, a pastor in South America, told me that when he was imprisoned in his home country because of his opposition to the oppression of the dictatorship, he was one day asked to prepare a Holy Communion service. The prisoners were waiting for judgement at the hands of their torturers. The pastor accepted. The liturgy was prepared but when the service began, he realised that he had forgotten the bread and the wine. Not easy to improvise a Communion service in a prison!

The pastor then had the idea of a **symbolic communion.** The participants went through the motions of receiving the bread and the wine. For a few brief moments those prisoners lived a deliverance from their condition, watched by the guards who could not believe what was happening.

On that day, that prison became the *House of Bread*, that immaterial element of the intangible inheritance of God.

It is true for the bread as it is true for the Magnificat, the immaterial song sung by Mary as she felt her Baby move in the womb. A song for children of the world over, as in the Yves Duteuil song – "Pour les enfants du monde entier."

Let it be so each time we sing Christmas and we share our daily bread – God gives it heritage to the world.

SERMONS (cont.)

My second choice is also a sermon of Advent (hardly surprising really!). It was given by Roy Carter in Chef Boutonne. These are his notes.

Who's ready? Christmas is just 28 days away (Dear Reader, by the time you see this, Christmas will be gone! But the thoughts expressed here remain – Ed) Now you really didn't want to know that, did you? In fact, telling you that was probably a pretty stupid idea, because now you'll spend the rest of the time I am talking thinking about all that you have to do to prepare, the presents to buy, the menu, when to put the decorations up, and so it goes on!!

Isn't it remarkable how so often, Christmas seems to "sneak up on us?" and yet it happens quite remarkably on December 25th every year? How do we miss it? I mean, it's not like the advertisers haven't been reminding us about it since August, so it seems!! And if that weren't enough, we even have Advent calendars, specifically designed to count down the days to Christmas Day. The word 'ADVENT' comes from the Latin word 'Adventus', or in the Greek as Parousia meaning "coming."

But what if we didn't have any calendars to tell us what day Christmas was coming on? We knew Christmas was coming, but didn't know the *exact* day? We wouldn't be able to procrastinate, would we? We would have to be *always ready* for when Christmas was announced!

Our Gospel Reading (Matthew chapter 24, verses 36 to 44) speaks of being prepared. If we are not ready for Christmas, the worst that can happen is someone goes without a present or two, and you may have to have a 'makeshift' meal.

But Jesus warns us here in this passage that if you are not ready for His Second Coming, it will be too late, and the thing is, that we don't have a calendar to tell us when He is coming again.

SO, WHAT ABOUT THE SECOND COMING OF JESUS CHRIST?

We are told in Matthew 24 verse 44 "You must be ready all the time, for the Son of Man will come when least expected." THE RETURN OF JESUS CHRIST IS GOING TO BE A PRETTY BIG EVENT, if I can put it that way, and we will need to be ready. In many ways, we are used to people turning up unexpectedly, many of whom we would be pleased to see, and the fact that we weren't expecting them by having the place spic and span wouldn't be an issue; we would shrug our shoulders and simply say, "Ah, if they can't take us as they find us, tough!!"

The question is, how would that approach be when Jesus Christ returns, that, "Ah well, He'll take me as He finds me?"

JESUS USES AN INTERESTING EXAMPLE, NAMELY THAT OF BEING BURGLED. He says, that "if the homeowner knew exactly when a burglar was coming, he would have kept watch and not permit his house to be broken into. You much also be ready all the time, for the Son of Man will come when least expected." (Verses 43 & 44)

The thing is, a burglar comes unexpectedly, he takes our valuables that doesn't belong to him, BUT when Jesus Christ comes unexpectedly, He is collecting the valuables that already belong to Him, you, and me as His redeemed people!!

THE QUESTION IS, THEN, WHAT CAN WE DO TO BE READY?

Well, one important point to make first is, don't believe what is written in various books and pamphlets or get mentioned on the TV God channels about the Second Coming.

As Scripture makes clear, the Angels don't know when Jesus Christ will return and neither in fact, does Jesus Himself know when He will come the Second time, that is SOMETHING ONLY HIS FATHER KNOWS!!

Matthew 24 verse 36 says, "However, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven or the Son himself. Only the Father knows."

THE SECOND COMING OF JESUS CHRIST IS THE CHRISTIAN'S BLESSED HOPE — not in the vague way that we use the word 'hope', but rather more in definitive and confident manner. Let's look at Titus 2:11 to 15

¹¹ For the grace of God has been revealed, bringing salvation to all people. ¹² And we are instructed to turn from godless living and sinful pleasures. We should live in this evil world with wisdom, righteousness, and devotion to God, ¹³ while we look forward with hope to that wonderful day when the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ, will be revealed. ¹⁴ He gave his life to free us from every kind of sin, to cleanse us, and to make us his very own people, totally committed to doing good deeds.

¹⁵ You must teach these things and encourage the believers to do them.

In the Bible, there is absolutely *nothing* vague about it. Biblically it means 'absolute confidence, optimism, expectation and faith'.
